

This Indenture made the twenty sixth day of October one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight Between The Queens Most Excellent Majesty of the first The Honorable James New Forest Kenneth Howard Commissioner of Her Majestys Woods Forest Lots 10, 12 & 46 and Land Revenues to whom the management and direction of certain parts of the Woods Forests and Land Revenues of the Crown including therin the The Honble Royal New Forest with the duties and powers appertaining thereto have been assigned by order under the hands of the lords Commissioners of Her Majestys Treasury made in pursuance of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament Mr Zach: Buttholder in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Chap 12) of the second Zachariah Bull of Haywood Mills Conveyance near Lympington in the County of Hants Miles of the third part and of several pieces Samuel Woodman of Sandy Down in the parish of Boldre in the open waste County of Southampton Yeoman of the fourth part Whereas by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament Holden in the seventeenth and eighteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Chap 19 intituled Sandy Down in the Act for the settlement of claims upon and over the New Forest in the parish of After reciting or noticing therein an act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said Majesty Chap 76 intituled An act to extinguish the rights of the Crown to Deer in the New Forest and to give compensation in lieu thereof and for other purposes relating to the said Forest and certain subsequent acts It was by the twenty ninth section of the act now in recital (17 and 18 Vic: Cap 49) enacted That for the purpose of defraying the expences hereinafter mentioned the Commissioners of Her Majestys Woods Forests and Land Revenues should on behalf of Her Majesty in addition to the sales then made or agreed to be made from time to time sell and dispose of by Public Auction or tender such parts of the open waste lands of the said Forest as they and any two Verderers of the said Forest may deem most convenient and after receipt of the Commissioners of Her Majestys Woods Forests and Land Revenues for the time being to whom the money to be raised by such sale was directed to be paid should be a sufficient discharge for the purchase money to all persons purchasing who should not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money nor to enquire whether the sale was made with the assent of the Verderers as aforesaid And it was by the said Act now in recital further enacted that all acts matters and things to be done or authorized to be done by the Commissioners of Her Majestys Woods Forests and Land Revenues in pursuance or the said Act now in recital or of the acts therein recited or any of them might be done by the Commissioner or other Officer for the time being of Her Majesty in charge of the said Forest And whereas

Drury in the Verderers Court Room at the Queens House Lyndhurst on Thursday the eighth day of July One thousand eight hundred and fifty eight in several Lots according to certain particulars and conditions of sale then and there produced at which Auction the said Zachariah Butt was the highest bidder for and was declared to be the purchaser of Lots 40, 12 and 16 in the said Particulars at or for the price or sum of Two hundred and fifteen pounds and the sum of Fifty three pounds fifteen shillings was then and there paid by or on behalf of the said Zachariah Butt to the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid or his agent as a deposit and in part payment of the purchase money of the said Lots AND whereas the said Zachariah Butt hath requested that the hereditaments comprised in the said Lots may be conveyed to him as hereinafter mentioned and the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid hath in pursuance of the said Conditions of sale required the said Zachariah Butt to enter into such covenants as are hereinafter contained Now this Indenture witnesseth that in pursuance of the said recited Contract for sale and in consideration of the sum of Fifty three pounds fifteen shillings so paid by way of deposit as aforesaid and of the further sum of One hundred and sixty one pounds five shillings the balance of the said purchase money to the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid so immediately before the execution of these presents in hand well and truly paid by the said Zachariah Butt the receipt of which said sums of Fifty three pounds fifteen shillings and One hundred and sixty one pounds five shillings making together Two hundred and fifteen pounds in full for the absolute purchase of the pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments hereinafter particularly described and hereby conveyed or intended so to be the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid doth hereby acquit and acknowledge and thereof and therefore and from every part thereof doth hereby acquit release and discharge the said Zachariah Butt his appointees heirs executors administrators and assigns and every of them for ever by these presents The said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the power for that purpose given to or vested in him by the said hereinbefore
