

of Open Waste Whereas by an act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the  
Lands of the Seventeenth and Eighteenth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty Chap. 14  
New Forest intituled "An Act for the Settlement of Claims upon and over the New Forest"  
at Langley Green after reciting or noticing wherein an act passed in the Session of Parliament  
and West held in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth years of Her said Majesty Chap. 16 intituled  
Common Fawley "An Act to extinguish the right of the Crown to Deer in the New Forest and  
Hants. to give compensation in lieu thereof and for other purposes relating to the said  
Forest" and certain subsequent acts It was by the Twenty ninth section of the  
act now in recital (15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> Vic Cap 40) Enacted That for the purpose  
of defraying the expenses theremore mentioned the Commissioners of Her  
Majestys Woods Forests and Land Revenues should on behalf of Her Majesty  
in addition to the sales then made or agreed to be made from time to time  
sell and dispose of by Public auction or tender such parts of the open Waste  
lands of the said Forest as they and any two Verderers of the said Forest might  
deem most convenient and the Receipt of the Commissioners of Her Majestys  
Woods Forests and Land Revenues for the time being (to whom the money to  
be raised by such sale was directed to be paid) should be a sufficient  
discharge for the purchase money to all persons purchasing who should not

Draper in the vestees' Court Room at the Queen's House Liverpool on Thursday the eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight in several lots according to certain Particulars and conditions of Sale then and there produced at which auction the said Thomas Row Sharland was the highest Bidder for who declared to be the Purchaser of Lots 112, 113, 114 and 116 in the said Particulars at or for the price or sum of One hundred and ten pounds and the sum Fifty two pounds ten shillings was then and there paid by or on behalf of the said Thomas Row Sharland to the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as a deposit or his Agent as a deposit and in part payment of the purchase money of the said Lots And whereas the said Thomas Row Sharland hath requested that the headlands comprised in the said Lots may be conveyed to him as hereafter mentioned and the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid hath in pursuance of the said Conditions of Sale required the said Thomas Row
