 doing as little damage as may be to the grass hereby agreed to be let —  
 Provided always and these presents are upon this condition that if the  
 sum of twelve pounds ten shillings being the moiety of the said rent of  
 Twenty five pounds hereby reserved which will become due on the second day  
 of August next or any part thereof shall be unpaid for twenty one days  
 next after that day or if the said Samuel Cawley his executors or administrators  
 shall at any time make default in the performance of the covenants hereinbefore  
 contained or any of them it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners or  
 Commissioners on behalf of The Queen's Majesty to determine and put an end  
 to this Agreement by giving to the said Samuel Cawley his executors or  
 administrators or leaving for him or them at his or their usual or last known

Dated 5<sup>th</sup> May 1862 This Indenture made the fifth day of May One thousand eight hundred and sixty two Between The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty of the first part The Honorable James Kenneth Howard County of Chester the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Woods Forests and Land Revenues to whom the management and direction of certain parts of the Land Revenues of the Crown including amongst other parts thereof the land and hereditaments hereinafter described together with the duties and powers appertaining thereto have been assigned by Order under the hands of two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury on behalf of Her Majesty of the second part and John Johnson of Runcorn in the County of Chester Esquire of the third part Whereas by an Award dated the seventeenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and nineteen made by the Commissioners appointed under an Act of Parliament passed in the fifty second year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the third for inclosing the Forest of Delamere in the County of Chester the said Commissioners did award and set out the two several pieces or parcels of Land covered with Water upon the said Forest next hereinafter mentioned to the Surveyor and Surveyors for the time being of the Highways of the several Townships within which the same respectively did lie as Watering places for Cattle and Beasts for the common use and benefit of all persons occupying Lands within the limits of the said Forest one of which said pieces of land so awarded and set out is described in the said Award as follows that is to say "Watering Place Plan 3. N<sup>o</sup> 184 containing sixteen perches near Lob Stack bounded Eastwardly by the Allotment N<sup>o</sup> 185<sup>a</sup> Westwardly and Northwardly by the Allotment N<sup>o</sup> 183<sup>a</sup> and Southwardly by the Northwich Road" And whereas the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid hath for and on behalf of Her Majesty contracted with the said John Johnson for the sale to him of the right and interest of Her Majesty in the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments for the sum of Two pounds and ten shillings and in consideration of his entering into the covenant hereinafter contained Now this Indenture witnesseth that in pursuance of the said contract and in consideration of the sum of Two pounds and ten shillings of lawful British money by the said John Johnson to the said James Kenneth Howard paid before the execution of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and in consideration of the covenant of the said John Johnson hereinafter contained the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid and in exercise of the powers in him vested by an Act of Parliament passed in the tenth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the fourth Chapter 50 and by another Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Cap 42.



 away the same doing as little damage as may be to the grass hereby agreed  
 to be let Provided always and these Presents are upon this condition  
 that if the sum of Seventeen pounds being the moiety of the said rent of  
 Thirty four pounds hereby reserved which will become due on the second  
 day of August next or any part thereof shall be unpaid for twenty one  
 days next after that day or if the said John Robinson his Executors or  
 administrators shall at any time make default in the performance of  
 the Covenants hereinbefore contained or any of them it shall be lawful for  
 the said Commissioners on behalf of The Queen's Majesty to determine and  
 put an end to this Agreement by giving to the said John Robinson his  
 Executors or administrators or leaving for him or them at his or their usual  
 or last known place or places of abode in England a notice of the intention  
 of the said Commissioner or Commissioners so to do and immediately after

the service of such Notice this Agreement shall cease and determine accordingly but without prejudice to any right of Action for the breach of any of the covenants hereinbefore contained previously committed and the said James Nemeth Howard doth hereby direct that this Agreement shall be deemed to be fully and sufficiently enrolled by the deposit of a duplicate thereof in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Involvements and the filing or making an entry of such deposit by the Keeper of the said Records and Involvements In witness whereof the said parties to these Presents of the second and third parts have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
