## Memorandum of an Agreement

made and entered into this twenty third day of March  
One thousand eight hundred and sixty three Between —  
The Honorable James Kenneth Howard the  
Commissioner of Her Majesty's Woods Forests and Land  
Revenues having the management and direction of the —  
Royal Forest of Dean in the County of Gloucester with  
the duties and powers appertaining thereto of the one part

The said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid  
hereby agrees to let and the said James Birt hereby agrees to  
take as Tenant to Her Majesty All that cottage tenement or dwelling  
house with the buildings and appurtenances thereto belonging now in the  
possession or occupation of the said James Birt situate and being in —  
Howbeach Valley in Blakeney Walk in the said Forest of Dean To hold  
unto the said James Birt his executors and administrators from the twenty  
fifth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty two as Tenant

Agreement from year to year at the Annual rent of Ten shillings to be paid to  
for letting a — Her Majesty's Receiver of Rent for the said Forest of Dean for the time  
Cottage or Tenement being free and clear of all and all manner of deductions whatsoever by  
and Premises at equal half yearly payments on the twenty fourth day of June and the  
Howbeach Valley twenty fifth day of December in each and every year Which said rent the  
in Blakeney Walk said James Birt doth hereby agree to pay on the days and times, and in  
in the Forest of manner aforesaid without any deduction or abatement whatsoever And  
Dean. — the said James Birt hereby further agrees to pay all taxes rates charges —  
assessments and impositions whatsoever to be charged upon or in respect of  
Tenancy from year to year the said premises and to keep the said premises in good and tenantable  
order and condition damage by fire or other inevitable accident only  
excepted And it is hereby expressly agreed and declared

Rent 10/- per Ann: by and between the said parties witness that if the said rent shall be in  
from 25<sup>th</sup> December appear for the space of twenty one days next after either of the said days  
of payment of rent, or if the said James Birt shall commit any breach  
of the Conditions of this Agreement it shall be lawful for Her Majesty  
her heirs or successors or her or their proper Office to enter upon the said  
premises or any part thereof in the name of the whole and to put an  
end to this Agreement or Demise and thereupon to evict the said James  
Birt his executors and administrators and all other occupiers thereof from

the said premises without any legal process And the said James Kenneth Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid doth hereby direct that this Deed shall be deemed to be fully and sufficiently enrolled by the deposit of a duplicate thereof in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Involvements and the filing or making an entry of such deposit by the keeper of the said Records and Involvements.
