

made the twenty fifth day of November One thousand eight hundred and ninety five Between The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty of the first part Edward Stafford Howard Esquire a Commissioner of Her Majesty's Woods of the second part and The Great Western Railway Company hereinafter called the Company of the third part And Supplemental to an Indenture dated the seventeenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy four and made between The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty of the first part The Honorable James Kenneth Howard then a Commissioner of Woods and Gaveller of the Royal Forest of Dean of the second part and the Company of the third part which Indenture is hereinafter referred to as the principal Indenture Witnesseth that in consideration of the covenants hereinafter contained and on the part of the Company to be performed The said Edward Stafford Howard as such Commissioner as aforesaid and in exercise of the powers referred to in the principal Indenture Doth hereby grant to the Company Licence and permission to extend to extend the line of pipes licensed by the principal Indenture existing line for the conveyance of water through the waste lands belonging of pipes from to Her Majesty in the direction and situation shewly a yellow Laymore line upon the Plan drawn in the margin hereof To hold and enjoy the said Licence unto the Company from the tenth day of October One thousand eight hundred and ninety five for the period and upon the terms and conditions set forth in the principal Indenture dated 17<sup>th</sup> March 1844 And the Company hereby covenant with the Queen's Majesty Her Heirs and successors that from and after the said tenth day of October One thousand eight hundred and ninety five the rent covenants agreements and provisoies in the principal Indenture contained shall be read and have effect as if the Licence granted by these Presents had been contained in the principal Indenture and the line of pipes hereby authorised had been included in the principal Indenture and the rent of Two pounds charged in respect of the principal Indenture and these presents And the said Edward Stafford Howard doth hereby direct that this deed shall be deemed to be fully and sufficiently enrolled by the deposit of a duplicate thereof in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Inquisitions and the filing or matting an entry of such deposit by the Keeper of the said Records and,




2. To pay the Land tax and all other taxes, sewers and other rates charges assessments and impositions whatsoever which now are or at any time during the said term may be taxed assessed or imposed upon the said demised premises or any part thereof.
