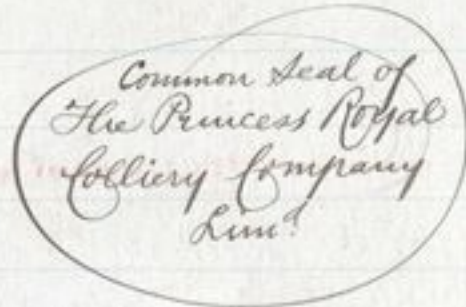

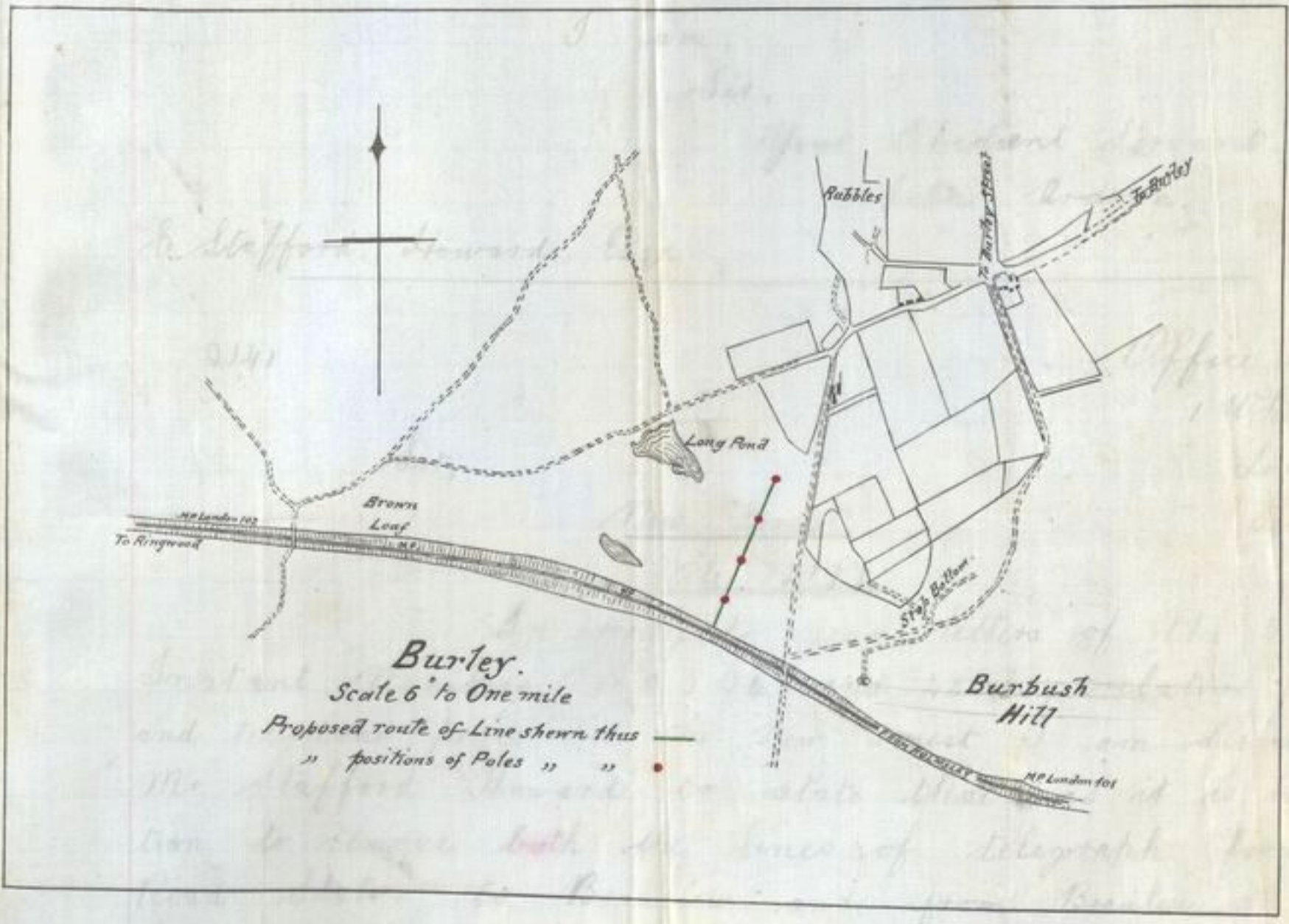

In reply to your letters of the 5th and 12th Instant, Numbers, 180224 and 458667 relative to telegraph and telephone poles in the New Forest I am directed by Mr. Stafford Howard to state that as it is in contemplation to remove both the lines of telegraph from Beaulieu Road Station to Beaulieu and from Beaulieu to Hythe he agrees that no fresh arrangement is necessary in regard to those lines. But with regard to the lines from Lyndhurst to Lyndhurst Road Station and from Lyndhurst to Bramshaw, I am to state that in future it will probably

be a saving of trouble to both Departments if some small acknowledgment is paid.

All the lines on Crown land in the Forest will thus be on the same footing and the payment of the acknowledgment will serve as a record of the arrangement.

I am therefore to state that Mr Howard is willing to give permission for the maintenance of the lines of telegraph poles along the roads leading from Lyndhurst to Lyndhurst Road Station and from Lyndhurst to Bramshaw so far as they affect Crown Property under his charge upon payment of an annual acknowledgment of 2/6 in respect of each line, the first payment to be made on receipt of this letter and subsequent payments to be made on 5th April annually to the Hon. 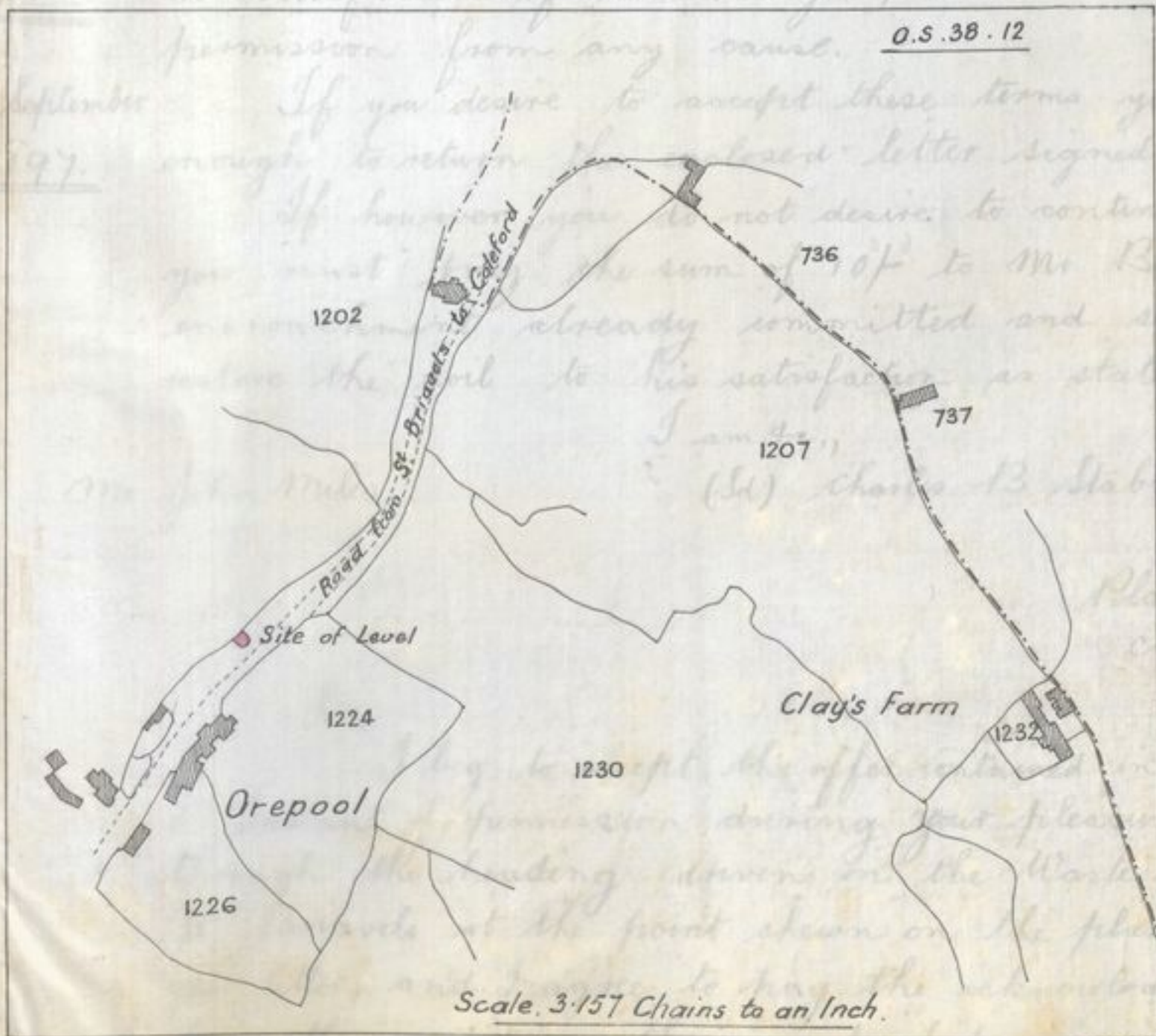

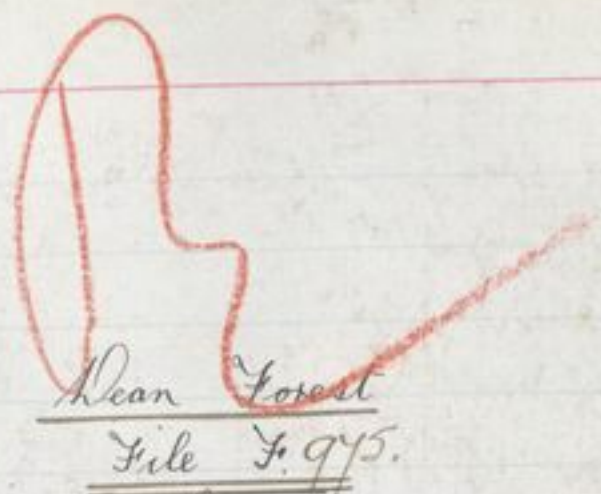
