situate in Ruardean Walk in the Forest of Dean and  
numbered 651, 662, 663, 664, 665 and 666 in one of the plans  
annexed to or which accompanied the second report of the  
Commissioners appointed under and by virtue of the Act 1st and 2nd  
William the Fourth Cap. 12 And whereas by his Will dated  
the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1860 the said William Barnett devised  
unto his wife Elizabeth Barnett All that his cottage or tenement  
garden and premises Together with the three pieces or parcels of  
land called respectively the Springpatch, Crosses Patch and the  
one adjoining the house or tenement called the Home Patch situate  
in Ruardean Walk Forest of Dean then in the occupation of  
Samuel James and Richard James for the term of her natural  
life and after her decease he gave and devised the same unto  
William Harris Senior his half brother his Heirs and Assigns  
for ever subje<sup>d</sup> nevertheless to the payment of £25 thereout to  
his niece Caroline Williams and he appointed his said wife

died on the 25<sup>th</sup> of December 1860 and his said Will was duly  
proved by his Widow the said Elizabeth Barnett on the 18<sup>th</sup>  
day of February 1861 in the Hereford District Registry And  
whereas by his Will dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of February 1876


the said William Harris after directing payment of his debts funeral and

 Elizabeth Barnett died in the month of January 1885 and the  
 said Susannah Harris died on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1886  
 And whereas the said legacy of £25 to the said Caroline  
 Williams was duly paid and the said William Harris died on  
 the 7<sup>th</sup> day of July 1886 and Letters of Administration to his Estate  
 with the will annexed were granted to William Harris one of the  
 children and residuary legatees of the Testator on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of  
 October 1886 by the District Registry of Gloucester And whereas  
 by an Indenture made the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May 1887 between William Harris  
 of the first part John Harris of the second part Susannah Hayward  
 Widow of the third part and Alfred Payne of the fourth part  
 after reciting (inter alia) that the said William Harris the Testator  
 left three children and no more him surviving namely the  
 said William Harris party thereto John Harris and Susannah  
 Hayward and that the said William Harris party thereto John  
 Harris and Susannah Hayward had agreed that a partition  
 should be made between them of the lands and hereditaments  
 comprised in the several Schedules hereunder written and that  
 the entirety of the lands and hereditaments comprised in the  
 third Schedule should be taken in severalty by the said


## LINING WOOD





26<sup>th</sup> July 1900.

1. A Rent of 5/- per annum to be paid to the Deputy Surveyor on the 29<sup>th</sup> September in each year during the continuance of the Licence together with a Royalty of 1d per ton of 2240 lbs weight on all stone if any beyond the quantity of 60 tons gotten and sold or otherwise disposed of within the year to that date. The first payment of the rent of 5/- to be made on the 29<sup>th</sup> September next.

2. Proper Accounts are to be kept and returns rendered to the Deputy Surveyor on the 29<sup>th</sup> September in each year of all stone gotten and sold used or otherwise disposed of.

3. The licence may be determined either by the Commissioner of Woods or yourself on 29<sup>th</sup> September in any year by one months previous notice in writing sent through the post.

If these terms are accepted I am to request that the enclosed letter may be signed dated and returned to this Office.

Under Sect. 23 of the Dean Forest Mines Act of 1838 a licence can only be granted to a registered Freeminer. If therefore you are qualified to be registered as a freeminer and will have yourself registered accordingly the licence might be granted to you direct, otherwise the enclosed letter must be signed by a Registered Freeminer to be nominated by you to take the license.
