This Indenture made the twenty sixth day of October One thousand nine hundred and seven Between the King's Most Excellent Majesty of the first part Edward Stafford Howard Esquire CB one of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Woods, Woods, and Land Revenues (hereinafter called the Commissioners) of which expression shall when the context admits include St. Briavels, the Commissioners and Commissioners for the time being) of the second part and Sir Grace Edward Goldring and William Wallace Hargrove both of 1699 Cannon Street in the City of London solicitors (hereinafter called the Mineral Claimants) which expression shall when the context so admits include their predecessors and successors in title) of the third part Whereas the Clearwell Court Estate is situate in the Parishes of Newland and St. Briavels within the Hundred of St. Briavels in the County of Gloucester but with the exception of so much thereof as was enclosed under the Walmore and Bearse Inclosure Act 1866 it is outside the limits of the Forest of Dean and previously to the same being put up for sale by public auction in June One thousand nine hundred and seven it was agreed between the Commissioners and the Mineral Claimants (who were mortgagees thereof and were selling under their statutory powers of sale as Mortgagees) that the claim to minerals under the said Estate made by the Mineral Claimants should be settled upon certain terms the principles of which had been arranged between the Commissioners and the Mineral Claimants and which are embodied in the provisions relating to the same hereinafter contained. And Whereas as to such parts of the said Estate other than a strip of land containing two roods and six perches near Inwood Farm marked B and hatched red on the plan hereto annexed as were not included in certain notices given by the Earl of Lummington in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty eight under

the 6th section of the Dean Forest Mines Act 1838 the coal and
 iron therein are liable to be gallored to the freeminers of the
 Forest of Dean and the owners of such lands are under section
 67 of the said Act entitled to one moiety of the net galloge rent &
 royalty or tonnage duty (after deducting all expenses of
 collection and recovery) received therefrom by the Crown
 and also under section 68 of the said Act to compensation
 for surface damage done or occasioned to such lands by
 the working of minerals thereout And whereas such
 parts of the said Estate as were enclosed under the Walmore
 and Pearce Inclosure Act 1866 form part of the Forest of
 Dean and the minerals therein are the property of His
 Majesty subject to such of the provisions of the Dean Forest
 Mines Act 1838 as are applicable thereto And whereas the
 minerals in the said strip of land containing two rods
 and six perches near Grewood Farm are the absolute
 property of His Majesty free from all rights of freeminers
 under the said Act of 1838 And whereas questions as
 to the ownership of the surface of a piece of land at Stow
 and the stone in a quarry thereon marked A on the said
 plan which had been and was being worked by a tenant
 of the then owner of the said Estate have arisen between
 the Commissioners and the mineral claimants And it has
 been agreed between the Commissioners and the mineral
 claimants that such questions shall be settled upon the
 terms hereinafter expressed concerning the same And
 whereas questions also have arisen as to the avenue of trees
 along the road from Beamscross to Stow Green also
 marked on the said plan and it has been agreed between
 the Commissioners and the mineral claimants that such
 questions should be settled upon the terms hereinafter expressed
 concerning the same Now this Indenture witnesseth
 and it is hereby mutually agreed and
 declared between and by the parties hereto as follows:

1. The Crown hereby admits the right of the mineral claimants
to all Minerals except Mines Royal in the lands hatched green,
on the said plan.
2. The mineral claimants hereby admit the right of the

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Crown to all minerals in so much of the lands coloured green on the said plan as is not hatched and that the Crown shall have full power to work such minerals making compensation in the usual manner in practice in the Forest of Dean for any damage caused to the surface by such workings and also subject as to such parts as are liable to be gaed to Mervis of the Forest of Dean to the payment to the Mineral claimants or other or others the owner or owners for the time being of the surface of such lands of one moiety of the net galeage rent royalty or tollage duty received therefrom by the commissioners.

3. The Crown shall convey to the Mineral claimants or their permitted assigns or nominees the Mervis Royal in the lands hatched green.
4. The Crown hereby releases all claim to the surface of the said piece of land marked A on the said plan wherein the said Quarry of stone lies and shall when called upon to do so grant a lease of the said stone to the Mineral claimants or their permitted nominees or nominee for a term of thirty one years from the twenty ninth day of September One thousand nine hundred and six at a certain or dead yearly rent of One pound merging into a royalty of One penny per ton of two thousand two hundred and forty pounds weight on all stone gotten sold used or otherwise disposed of such lease to be prepared by and at the cost of the Mineral claimants but to be approved of by the Commissioners and the Crown shall make no claim for past workings thereof.
5. The Crown shall henceforth maintain the said avenue of trees in good condition and when occasion shall require duly lop and trim the trees forming the same and plant other trees from time to time as occasion shall require in the place of decayed or dead or fallen trees and do whatever may be necessary so far as is practicable in order to continue the same as an avenue of ornamental trees.

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And the said Edward Stafford Howard doth hereby direct
that this Deed shall be deemed to be fully and sufficiently
enrolled by the deposit of a duplicate thereof in the Office of
Land Revenue Records and Involvements and the filing on or
making an entry of such deposit by the Keeper of the said
Records and Involvements.
