The Deputy Surveyor of the New Forest has reported to this Office your applications (1) for permission to lay several lines of pipes in the Forest to collect water for a swimming bath at Shobley as shown by red colour on plan No. I. herewith. To this Mr Stafford Howard has not objection, but he considers that it would be more convenient to merge the present proposed easement along with the permission, referred to below, you already possess, of laying and maintaining a line of water pipes into one single easement. This pipe is shown on the plan in black. 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
