Whereas an Agreement for the Commutation of the Tithes for the Parish of English Bicknor in the County of Gloucester has been duly made and executed and was confirmed by the Tithe Commissioners for England and Wales on the nineteenth day of April in the Year one thousand eight hundred and thirty three in pursuance of the Act of Parliament made for the Commutation of Tithes in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty William the Fourth And whereas The Rev Edward Field Rector of the said Parish of English Bicknor is desirous to obtain for himself and his Successors in the said Rectory a piece or parcel of Land situate in the said Parish of which piece a Parcel of Land Her Majesty in Right of Her Crown is Owner in Fee and which piece of Land consists of the following three Closes viz: <sup>W<sup>o</sup> 141 on # meadow Plan</sup> High Castle Bailey conty 3-3-20 <sup>W<sup>o</sup> 142 on # meadow Plan</sup> Middle Castle Bailey and Old House Field conty 0-1-4 and <sup>W<sup>o</sup> 146 on # meadow Plan</sup> Low Castle Bailey conty 5-2-39 making together 17-3-31 and is now cultivated part as pasture and part as Arable Land and is of the Annual Value of Twenty-two Pounds Six Shillings and is free from all incumbrances except the usual Outgoings upon Land - And whereas by the Draft of the Instrument appportioning the Renth Charge agreed to be given in Commutation of the Tithes of the said Parish the sum of sixteen Pounds fourteen Shillings and seven pence has been appportioned upon the Lands hereunder described of which Lands her said Majesty in Right of Her Crown is Owner (that is to say) 179-0-30 of Wood and Coppice 16-2-7 of Pasture and 23-3-18 of Arable Land making together in all 219-2-23 but such an appportionment has not yet been confirmed by the Tithe Commis<sup>s</sup> for England and Wales - Now Know all Men by these presents that in pursuance of the Powers to that effect given by the said Act of Parliament it is hereby agreed by and between the said Rev<sup>d</sup> Edward Field of the one Part and The Right Honble John William Baron Duncannon Alexander Milne Esq<sup>r</sup> and The Honorable Charles Alexander Gore The Commissioners of Her Majesty's Woods Forests Land Revenues Works and Buildings of the other



part in manner following (that is to say) The said Commissioners on behalf of Her Majesty in Consideration of the Sum of £303.13.0 paid by the said Edward Field out his proper Monies into the Bank of England to the Account of the said Commissioners entitled "The Woods and Works Cash Account." on the tenth day of December Now Instant under the Authority of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury testified by a warrant under their hands bearing date the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1840 Do hereby give grant and Convey to the said Edward Field and to his Successors in the Rectory of the said Parish for ever. All that Piece or Parcel of Land herebefore first described as containing 17.3.31 In Consideration of which the said Edward Field for himself and his Successors in the said Rectory hereby agrees that the said Sum of Fifteen Pounds fourteen Shillings and Seven Pence so apportioned as aforesaid upon the said Lands herebefore described as containing 219.2.23 shall be discharged and shall not be payable to the said Edward Field or his Successors so long as they shall enjoy the said Piece or Parcel of Land so given granted and Conveyed to them as aforesaid provided that in Case the said Edward Field or his Successors shall hereafter be evicted from the said Piece or Parcel of Land then the said Portion of Rent Charge herebefore relinquished and agreed to be deemed discharged shall revive and become payable to the said Edward Field and his Successors in the Rectory of the said Parish of English Bickner In testimony whereof the said Parties to this Agreement hereunto set their respective hands and Seals this Eleventh day of December in the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty -

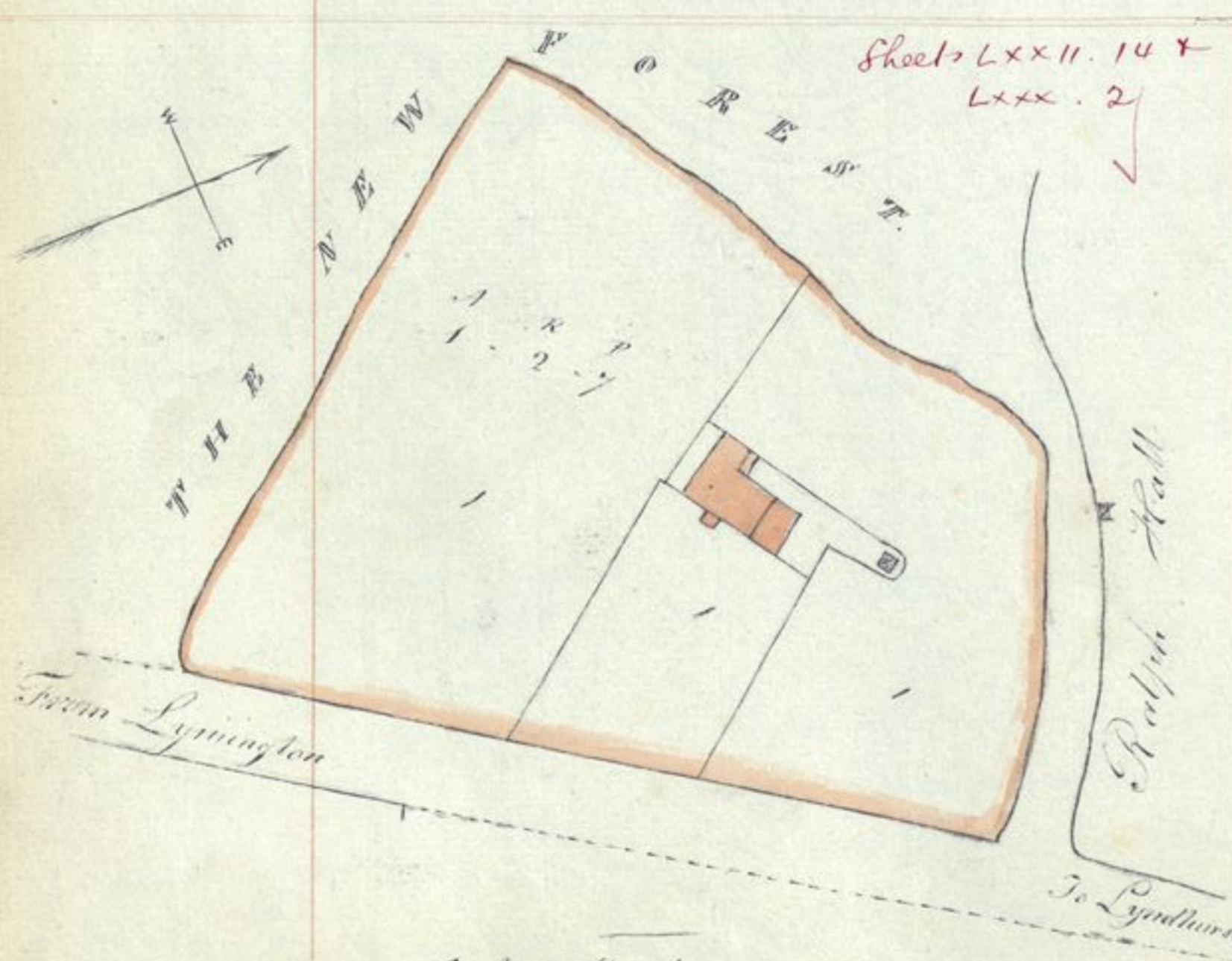

## Grant of Land at Synchhurst to enlarge the Churchyard

Victoria J.

We do hereby signify Our Will and Pleasure that the Grant following be made.

To all to whom these Presents shall come the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury send Greeting Whereas by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the 10<sup>th</sup> Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled "An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the management and improvement of His Majesty's Woods, Forests, Parks and Chases of the Land Revenue of the Crown within the Survey of the Exchequer in England and of the Land Revenue of the Crown in Ireland and for extending certain provisions relating to the same to the Isles of Man and Alderney" After reciting (amongst other things) that it was desirable His Majesty His Heirs and Successors should be at liberty to grant any Lands or Hereditaments part of the Possessions or Land Revenues of the Crown to which the now reciting Act related for any of the purposes therein mentioned whenever he or they should be graciously pleased so to do It was enacted that The King's most excellent Majesty His heirs and successors should at any time thereafter have full power and authority out of the said Possessions and Land Revenues of the Crown to which the now reciting Act related to give and grant to and vest in any Body or Bodies Politic or Corporate or any person or persons whomsoever their heirs and successors respectively for such Estate or interest therein as to His Majesty His heirs and successors shall seem meet any Building proper to be used as or converted into or any ground proper for the site of any Church or Chapel with



or without a cemetery or burial ground thereto or any ground proper for a  
 cemetery or burial ground to any Church or Chapel and any House with its  
 appurtenances and with or without a Garden thereto proper for the  
 residence of the Spiritual Person who might serve such Church or Chapel  
 or any ground proper for the site or sites of any such Residence or for  
 any parochial or district School any thing in the now reciting Act or  
 any other Law or Statute to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding  
 and such Body or Bodies politic or corporate or person or  
 persons and their heirs, <sup>successors</sup> executors or administrators should have full  
 capacity and ability to take hold and enjoy the same and  
 whenever it should be the pleasure of His Majesty His heirs or  
 successors to make a grant for any of the purposes aforesaid  
 it should be lawful for the Lord High Treasurer or the  
 Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being to issue  
 a Warrant under His or Their Hand or Hands to any such Body  
 or Bodies politic or corporate or person or persons as aforesaid  
 which Warrant should be exempt from any Stamp Duty  
 whatsoever and should if the same should relate to a grant  
 in England and Wales be enrolled in — manner hereinafter  
 mentioned and the Enrolment of the said Warrant should be  
 certified at the foot or on the back thereof by the proper Officer or  
 Officers by whom the same should be enrolled under his or their  
 hand or hands and the said Warrant when so enrolled should  
 be returned with such certificate of Enrolment to the grantee or  
 grantees of such Lands and premises and from and  
 immediately after such Enrolment thereof the grantee or grantees  
 named in such Warrant and his or their heirs successors



agents or administrators should by force of the now reciting  
 Act be adjudged deemed or taken to be in the actual seizin or  
 possession of the premises in the said Warrant specified and  
 should hold and enjoy the same either absolutely and in  
 perpetuity or for such limited Estate term or interest and under  
 and subject to such reservations of rent or other acknowledgments  
 conditions and restrictions and upon such trusts and for such  
 purposes as should be specified inserted directed or contained  
 in such Warrant any Law Statute or Usage to the contrary  
 thereof in any wise notwithstanding And it was by the said  
 Act provided that nothing therein contained should extend or  
 be construed to extend to enable His Majesty His heirs or  
 successors to grant more than five Acres in any one Grant for  
 any of the purposes aforesaid or to grant any premises in  
 any one instance which should exceed in value the sum  
 of £1000 and it was thereby further enacted that all Deeds  
 or Instruments should within six months after the date thereof  
 respectively be enrolled <sup>that is to say until the determination as therein before mentioned</sup> as thereafter mentioned of the then  
 present remaining Office of Auditor of the Land Revenue of  
 the Crown the same should be enrolled in the Office of the  
 Auditors or Acting Auditor performing the duty of Auditor  
 of the Land Revenue of the Crown for the District in which the  
 premises comprised in such Deed or Instrument should be situate  
 or if situate in more than one of the Districts for which  
 Auditors of the Land Revenue of the Crown in England & Wales  
 were theretofore appointed then in the Office of the Auditors or  
 Acting Auditor for any one of such Districts and after the  
 determination of the then said present remaining Office



of Auditor of the Land Revenue of the Crown the said Deeds and other  
 Instruments should be enrolled in the Office of the Commissioners for  
 Auditing the public Accounts and a Minute or Document of every  
 such Deed or other Instrument should be entered and preserved  
 by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Woods Forests and Land Revenues  
 in their Office And whereas by an Act passed in the second year  
 of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the 4<sup>th</sup> intituled  
 "An Act for uniting the Office of the Surveyor General of His  
 Majesty's Works and Public Buildings with the Office of the  
 Commissioners of His Majesty's Woods Forests and Land Revenues  
 and for other purposes relating to the Land Revenues" It  
 was enacted that the persons to be appointed as therein
