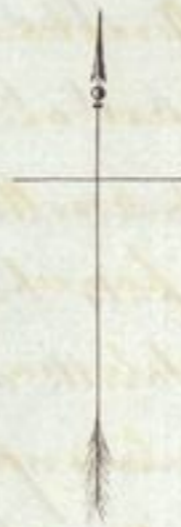

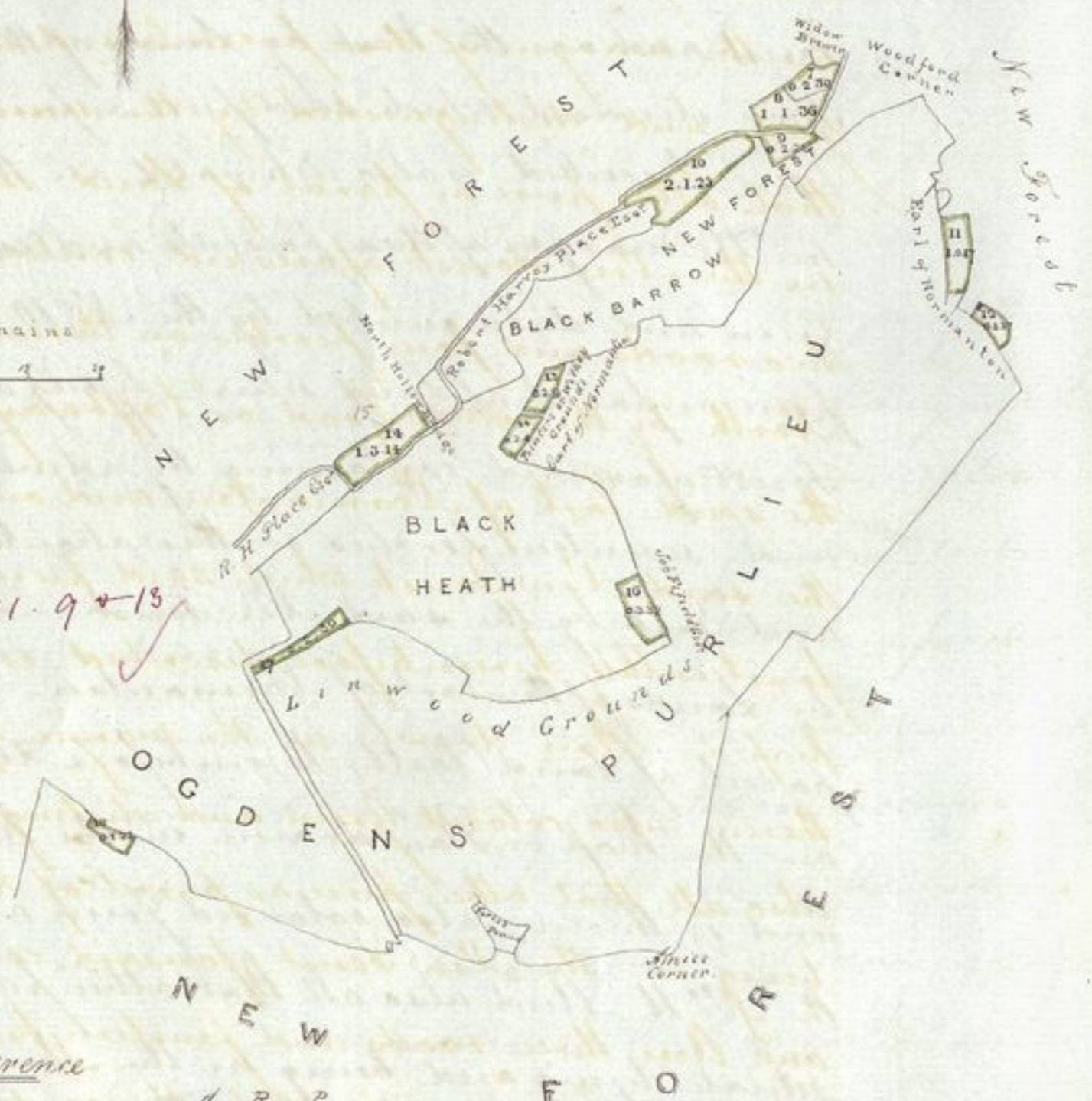
Plan of Lands part of the New Forest

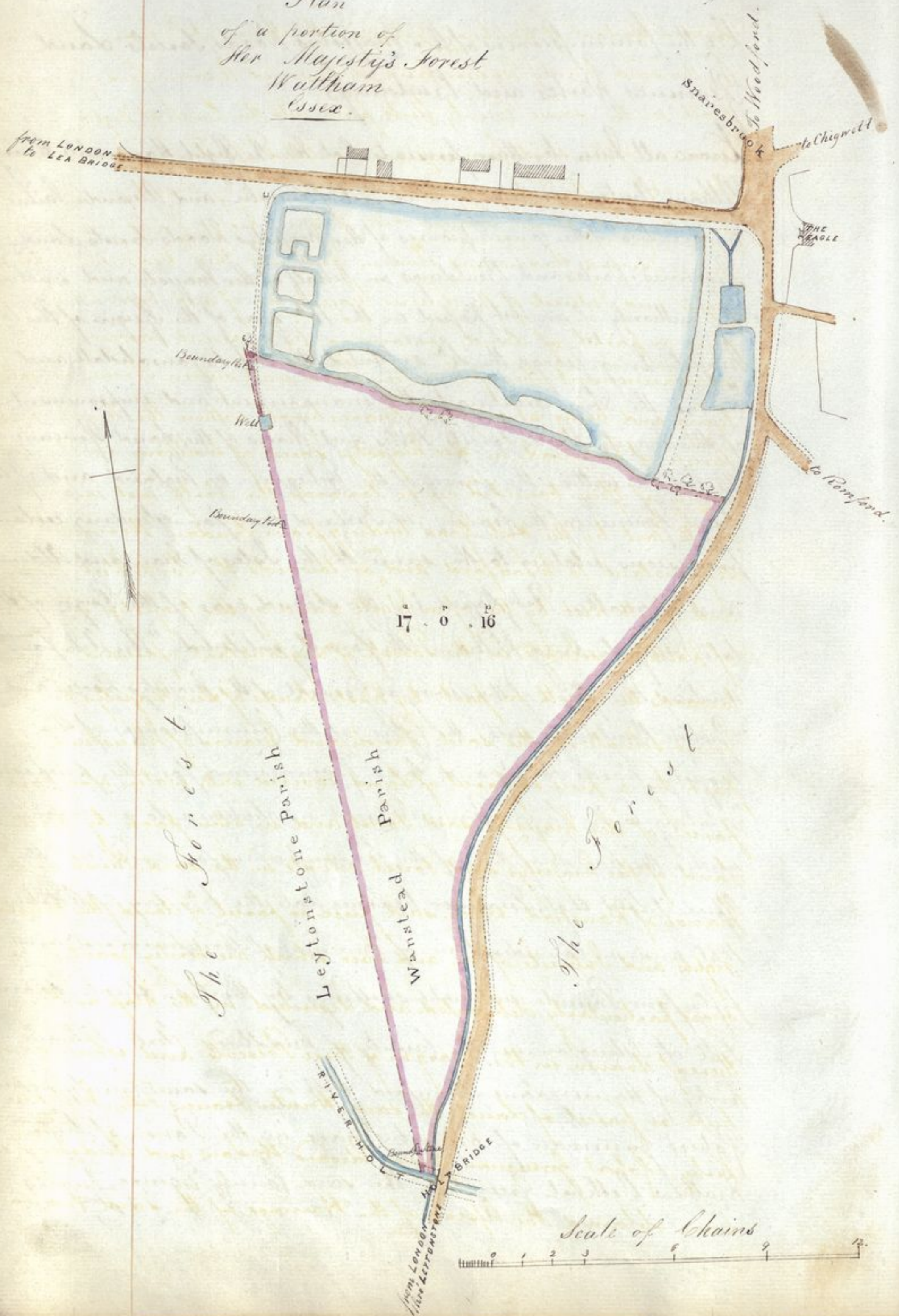
