Parliament made and passed in the tenth year of the Reign of His
late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to consolidate and
amend the Laws relating to the management and improvement of His
Majesty's Woods Forests Parks and Chases of the Land Revenue of the Crown
within the Survey of the Exchequer in England and of the Land
Revenue of the Crown in Ireland and for extending certain provisions
relating to the same to the Isles of Man and Alderney" After
reciting amongst other things that it was desirable that His
Majesty his heirs and successors should be at liberty to grant
any Lands or hereditaments part of the possessions or Land
Tenements of the Crown to which the now reciting Act related for
any of the purposes therein mentioned whenever he or they should
be graciously pleased so to do It was enacted that the King's
most Excellent Majesty his heirs and Successors should at any time
thereafter have full power and authority out of the said possessions
and Land Revenues of the Crown to which the now reciting Act

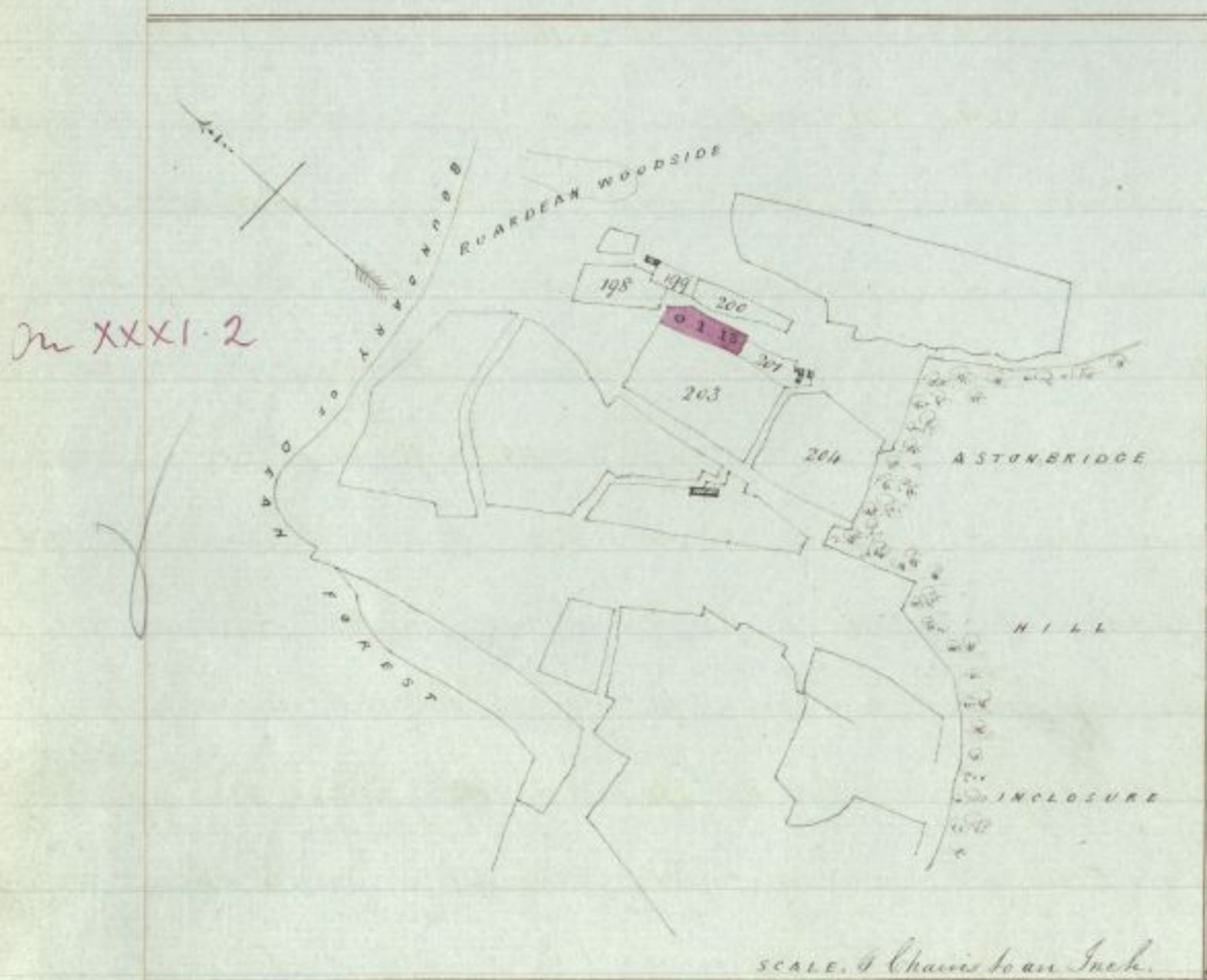

 should by force of the now reciting Act be adjudged deemed
 and taken to be in the actual seizin or possession of the
 premises in the said Warrant specified and should hold and
 enjoy the same either absolutely and in perpetuity or for such
 limited estate term and interest and under and subject to such
 reservations of Rent or other acknowledgments conditions or
 restrictions and upon such trusts and for such purposes as
 should be specified inserted directed or contained in such
 Warrant any Law Statute or usage to the contrary thereof

 and premises belonging or appertaining **To be holden** by the
 said Henry Nicholls and Charles Meste and their respective successors
 Ministers and Churchwardens for the time being of the said
 Ecclesiastical District for ever. It is nevertheless to be for ever
 hereafter appropriated and used as and for a site for a school
 for the education of children and adults or children only of
 the labouring, mining and other poorer classes in the Ecclesiastical
 District of the Holy Trinity within the Majesty's Forest of Dedon
 aforesaid and for no other purpose. And it is hereby declared that
 the said school shall be at all times open to the inspection of
 the Inspector or Inspectors of Schools for the time being
 appointed in conformity with the Order in Council bearing date
 the tenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty
 and shall always be in union with and conducted according to the
 principles and in furtherance of the ends and designs of the
 National Society for promoting the Education of the Poor in the
 principles of the Established Church throughout England and Wales
 and subject to and in conformity with the declaration aforesaid
 the said school and premises and the funds and present
 Endowments thereof and such future Endowments in respect whereof
 no other disposition shall be made by the Donor thereof shall
 be directed controlled governed and managed in manner hereinafter
 specified that is to say the principal officiating Minister for
 the time being of the said Ecclesiastical District or in
 his absence his licenced Curate shall have the superintendance
 of the religious and moral instruction of all the scholars

attending the said school with power to use or direct the
 premises to be used for the purposes of a Sunday school
 under his exclusive control and management. But, in all other
 respects the management, direction, control and government of the
 school and premises and of the funds and endowments
 thereof and the selection, appointment and dismissal of the
 schoolmaster and schoolmistress and their assistants (except when
 under the provisions hereinafter mentioned the dismissal of any
 master, mistress or assistant shall be awarded by the
 Bishop of the Diocese or the Arbitrators as the case may
 be) shall be vested in and exercised by a Committee consisting
 of the principal officiating Minister for the time being his
 licensed curate or curates if the Minister shall appoint him
 or them to be a member or members of the said
 Committee the churchwardens for the time being of the said
 Ecclesiastical District and of two other persons of whom the
 following shall be the first appointed, that is to say, Edward
 Mearns of Whitbread Lane, Colford, in the County of Gloucester
 Esquire and Timothy Bennett of Milsbredon in the said County
 of Gloucester Esq. Proprietor the said other persons continuing to
 be communicants of the Church of England as by Law established.
 And any vacancy which may occur in the number of persons
 last mentioned by death, resignation, incapacity or otherwise shall
 be filled up by the election of a person being a
 communicant of the said Church and the power of
 electing such person shall be vested in the remaining members
 of the said Committee until the Bishop of the Diocese

within which the said school shall be situated shall in writing direct that the election shall be by the contributors to the funds of the said school and thereupon and thenceforth such election shall be vested in such of the contributors during the three current years to the amount of Ten shillings each the least to the funds of the said school being members of the said school church of England as shall be present at the meeting duly convened for the purpose of the election or not being present thereat shall vote by any paper or papers sent on or before the day of such meeting to the chairman thereof and signed by any such contributor in which shall be named the person or persons whose such contributor shall desire to elect and each of the contributors qualified to vote shall be entitled at every such election to give one vote in respect of each such sum of Ten shillings so however that no person shall be entitled to give more than six votes in respect of any sum so contributed. Provided nevertheless that no appointment to serve the office of Warden nor any election whether by the other Members of the said committee as first aforesaid or by the said contributors to the funds of the said school as last aforesaid shall give or vest any right to or in any lay person to serve upon the committee or in anywise to interfere with the management of the said school and the funds and endowments thereof until after he shall have at a meeting of the said committee made and signed in a Book to be kept at the said school in the presence of the Chairman a

Declaration in the manner and form following, that is to say,
"I, A. B. do solemnly and sincerely declare that I and we
have been for three years last past a communicant of the
Church of England." Provided also that no default of election
nor any vacancy shall prevent the other members of the Committee
from acting until the vacancy shall be filled up. And it is
hereby declared that no person shall be appointed or continue to
be the Master or Mistress of the School who shall not be
a member of the Church of England. And the said Committee
shall annually select one of the members thereof to act as

Management hereinbefore mentioned respecting the prayers to be
used in the School not being the Sunday School or the

Religious instruction of the scholars attending the same or any
 regulation connected therewith or the exclusion of any Book
 the use of which in the said school may be objected
 to on Religious grounds or the dismissal of any Teacher from
 the said school on account of his or her defective or
 unsound instruction of the children in religion the Minister
 or Curate or any Member of the Committee may cause a
 written statement of the matter in difference to be laid before
 the Bishop a copy thereof having been previously communicated to
 the Committee or Minister or Curate if they or he shall
 not have been parties or privy to the making of the statement
 respectively and the Bishop may enquire concerning and determine
 the matter in difference and the decision of the Bishop in
 writing under his hand thereon when laid before the Committee
 shall be final and conclusive in the matter. And the
 Committee of Management for the time being is hereby expressly
 required to take all such steps as may be necessary for
 immediately carrying the said Decision into complete effect. And
 in case any difference other than and except such difference as
 last described shall arise in the Committee of Management
 the minority thereof (being not fewer in number than one
 third of the whole of the Committee) may make request in
 writing to the Lord President of Her Majesty's Most Honourable
 Privy Council for the time being and to the Bishop of the Diocese
 wherein the said School shall be situated and thereupon the
 said Lord President may nominate one of the Inspectors of Schools

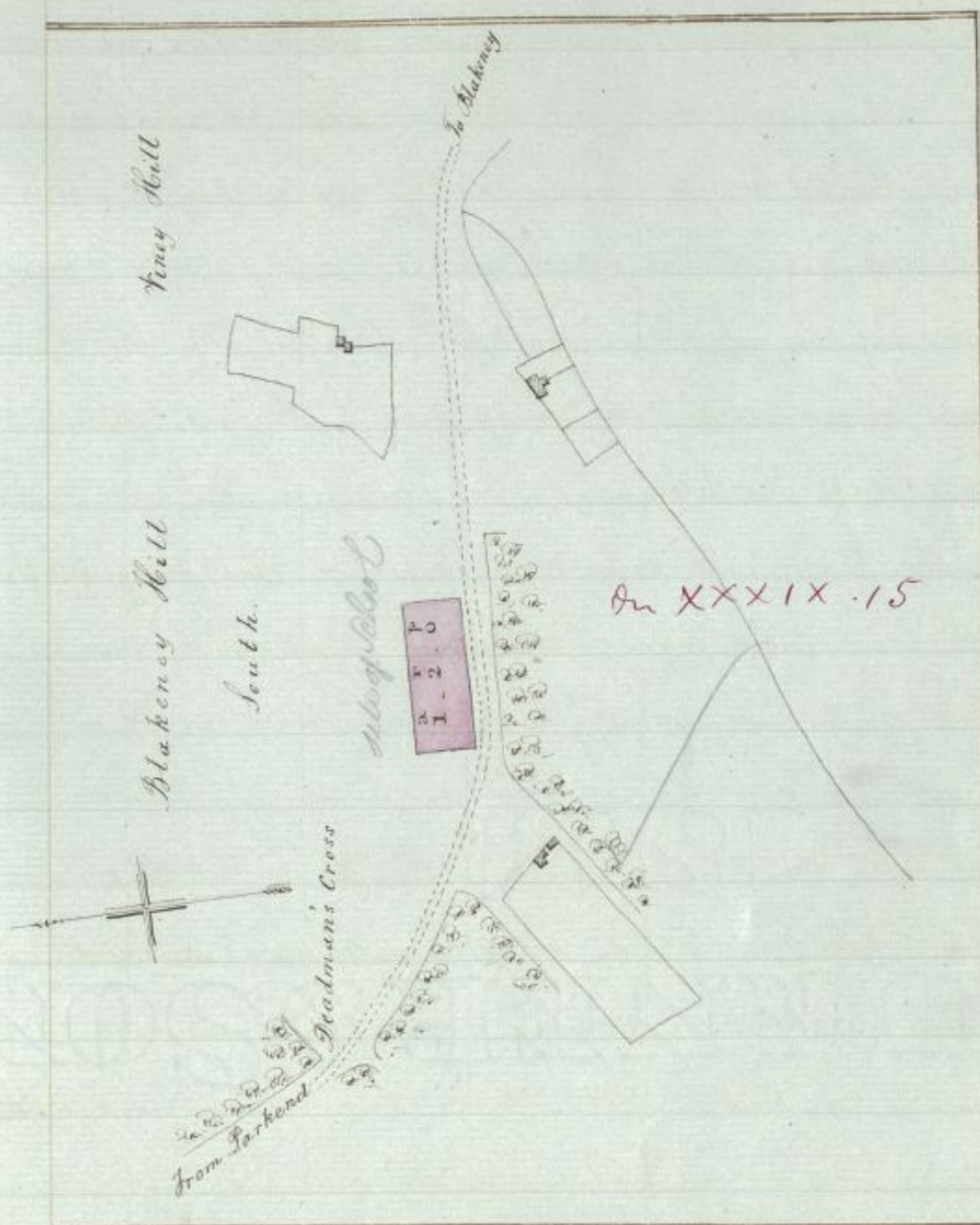

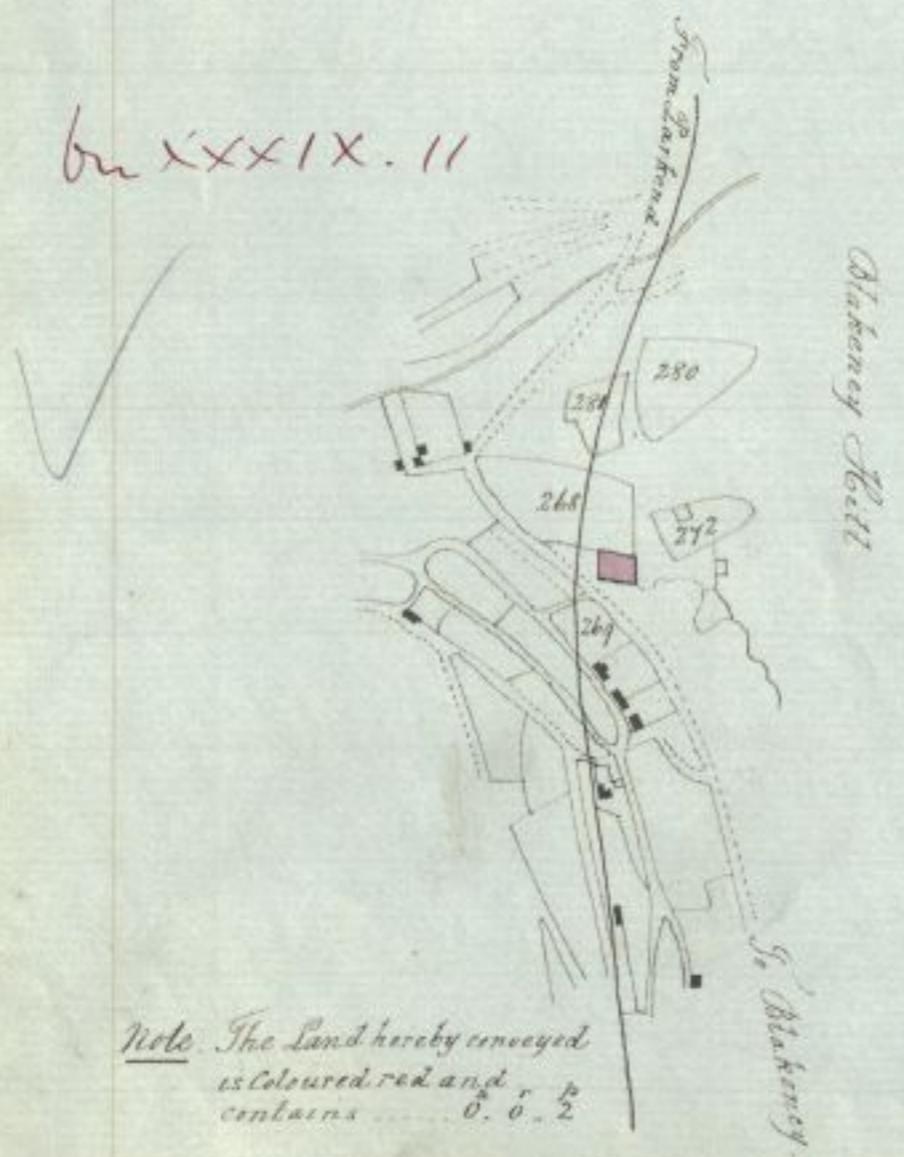

 expressly required to take all such measures as may be necessary for immediately
 carrying the said Award into complete effect And it is hereby further declared that
 if the said Bishop or the said Arbitrators upon any such Reference as aforesaid shall
 direct or award that any Master Mistress or Teacher in the said School shall be
 dismissed such direction or award when a Copy thereof shall have been served upon the
 said Master Mistress or Teacher personally or by the same being left at his or her
 place of abode or at the School aforesaid addressed to the said Master Mistress or
 Teacher as the case may require shall operate as a dismissal of the said Master
 Mistress or Teacher so as to prevent him or her hereafter from having any interest
 in his or her Office or in the said School or premises under or by virtue of
 this Decree and so as to disqualify him or her from holding hereafter any right
 or interest under this Decree by virtue of his or her previous or any future appointment
 And the said Committee at a Meeting to be held in the month of June in each
 year may elect and appoint a Committee of not more than five Ladies being
 members of the said Church of England to assist them in the visitation and management
 of the Girls and Infants Schools which said Committee shall remain in office until the
 end of the current year And from and immediately after the enrolment of this Warrant in
 the Office of Land Revenue Records and Jurisdictions and the entry of a Minors or Proquest thereof
 in the Office of the Commissioners of the Majestys Woods Forests Land Revenues Works and Buildings
 and thenceforth for ever the said Grants and their heirs and assigns shall by force of
 the said Act of the tenth year of the Reign of the late Majesty King George the Fourth
 be adjudged deemed and taken to be in the actual vigour and possession of the premises
 hereunto given and granted and shall hold and enjoy the same in trust and for the

purposes aforesaid peaceably and quietly hold and discharged of and from all claims and demands which can or may be made by the Majesty her heirs or successors or by any person or persons lawfully claiming by from or under her or them, and of and from all manner of incumbrances whatsoever as fully and amply to all intents and purposes as the Majesty her heirs or successors might or could have held or enjoyed the same subject nevertheless to the proviso or condition hereinafter inserted and contained

Provided always that this present grant is made upon this express condition that if at any time hereafter the said piece or parcel of Land hereby granted or the Buildings to be erected thereon or any part thereof shall be applied to appropriated or used for any other purpose than as a School for the Education of Infant Children of the Labouring Living and other poor classes in the Eastern portion of the Ecclesiastical District of Saint Paul within the Majesty's Forest of Dean then and in such case and immediately thereupon this present grant shall cease determine and be void to all intents and purposes whatsoever and it shall and may be lawful to and for the Majesty her heirs and successors or the Commissioners for the Time being of the Majesty's Woods Forests Land Revenues Works and Buildings on the Majesty's behalf into and upon the said piece or parcel of Land and premises hereby granted to revert and the same to have again repossess and enjoy as part of the Land Revenues of the Crown free from all claims and demands of the said Henry Steele and John Branch and their respective successors (any thing herebefore contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding) GIVEN under our hands at the Treasury Chambers this third day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one.
