

This Indenture

In the matter of the Act for disafforesting Hamiault Forest

made the twenty seventh day of December One thousand eight hundred and fifty two *Between Sir Charles Hulst of Breamore House in the County of Southampton Baronet of the first part The Honorable Charles Alexander Gore and The Right Honorable Thomas Francis Kennedy the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Woods Forests and Land Revenues of the second part and The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty of the third part Whereas the said Sir Charles Hulst is seized to him and his heirs for an Estate of inheritance in fee simple in possession of and in the pieces or parcels of Land or Ground cottages or tenements and hereditaments herein after more particularly described and hereby conveyed or otherwise assured or intended so to be free from all incumbrances save and except or subject as hereinafter mentioned And whereas the said Charles Alexander Gore and Thomas Francis Kennedy as such Commissioners as aforesaid acting on behalf of Her Majesty and in pursuance of the provisions of an Act passed in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act for disafforesting the Forest of Hamiault in the County of Essex" with the assent of Sir Frederick Thesiger Knight Her Majesty's Attorney General lately entered into a compromise with the said Sir Charles Hulst for the claim which he made as Lord of the Manor of Barking in and to the soil of that portion of the said Forest of Hamiault which is called the Kings Forest or Kings Woods And whereas by a certain deed or Indenture bearing date on or about the twenty sixth day of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty two and made or expressed to be made between the said Charles Alexander*

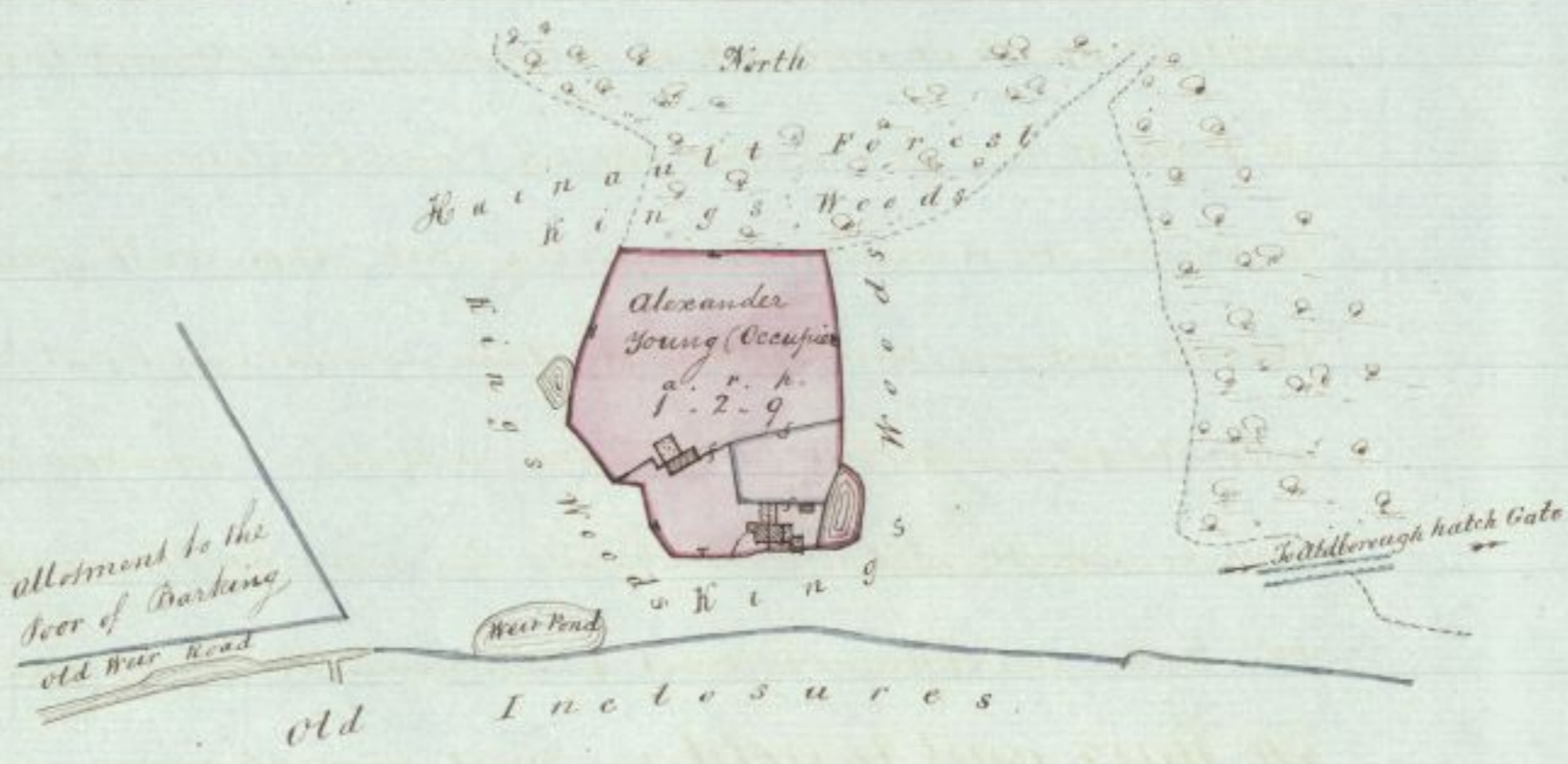

 expence make out and deduce a good Title to the fee simple and
 inheritance in possession of the three Cottages or tenements and the
 pieces or parcels of Land thereto respectively belonging or occupied
 therewith described in the third Schedule to the said Deed and
 hereinafter more particularly described and hereby conveyed or
 intended so to be and convey the same free from all incumbrances
 to The Queens Majesty her heirs and Successors And whereas
 the said Charles Alexander Eyre and Thomas Francis Kennedy as
 such Commissioners as aforesaid have requested that the said
 several pieces or parcels of Land Cottages or tenements and hereditaments
 may be conveyed to The Queens Majesty her heirs and Successors as
 hereinafter mentioned And whereas the said pieces or parcels of
 Land Cottages or tenements hereditaments and premises are in fact
 with other hereditaments subject or liable to a contingent Annuity or
 yearly Rent Charge of One thousand pounds payable to Dame Maria
 Hulse ^{the Wife of the said Sir Charles Hulse} for her life in the event of her surviving the said Sir Charles
 Hulse the said Sir Charles Hulse hath at the request of the said
 Charles Alexander Eyre and Thomas Francis Kennedy as such
 Commissioners as aforesaid and in order to indemnify The Queens

Majesty her heirs and Successors or the Lands tenements and hereditaments
 hereby intended to be conveyed from the payment or part payment of
 the said Annuity or jointure Rent Charge of One thousand pounds
 agreed in lieu and satisfaction of the stipulation in the said
 Indenture of the twenty sixth of August One thousand eight hundred
 and fifty two contained and hereinbefore recited to give and execute such
 Indemnity as is hereinafter contained *Now this Indenture*
witnesseth that in pursuance and performance of the said Agreement
 or terms of compromise aforesaid and for the purpose of carrying the
 same into effect and in consideration of the premises and of ten shillings
 to the said Sir Charles Hulst in hand paid by the said Charles
 Alexander Gore and Thomas Francis Kennedy as such Commissioners
 as aforesaid on behalf of Her Majesty the receipt whereof is hereby

 by the said Sir Charles Hulse or by Sir Edward Hulse deceased

 right and full power to grant and convey the said Lands and
 hereditaments hereby granted and conveyed unto and to the use of
 the Queen's Majesty her heirs and Successors in manner aforesaid and

 charges in the Law of The Queen's Majesty her heirs and Successors
 make do and execute or cause or procure to be made done and
 executed all and every such further and other lawful and reasonable
 acts deeds conveyances releases and assurances in the Law whatsoever
 for the further better more perfectly and absolutely conveying releasing or

otherwise assigning the said several pieces or parcels of Land Cottages
 or tenements hereditaments and premises heretofore described and
 hereby conveyed and released or intended so to be with their
 appurtenances unto and to the use of the Queen's Majesty her heirs
 and Successors as by the Commissioners for the time being of Her
 Majesty's Woods Forests and Land Revenues or by the Law Officers
 of The Crown for the time being shall be reasonably devised or
 advised and required **And** the said Sir Charles Hulse doth hereby
 for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns covenant
 promise and agree with and to The Queen's Majesty her heirs and
 Successors that (unless hindered or prevented by fire or other inevitable
 accident) he the said Sir Charles Hulse his heirs executors administrators
 or assigns shall and will from time to time and at all times hereafter
 at the request costs and charges of The Queen's Majesty her heirs or
 Successors or of the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Woods
 Forests and Land Revenues produce and show forth or cause or procure
 to be produced and shown forth unto The Queen's Majesty her heirs
 Successors or assigns or unto the said Charles Alexander Gore and
 Thomas Francis Kennedy as such Commissioners as aforesaid or one
 of them or to the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's
 Woods Forests and Land Revenues or the Law Officers of The Crown
 for the time being or at any Trial or Hearing in any Court of Law
